Reader advisory: Any resemblance between a well-loved fairy tale and the story you're about to read is completely intentional!

Once upon a time, there was a farmer; we'll call him Peter (for a very good reason--that's his name). In 1980, Peter moved to Wisconsin and bought a 320-acre farm on which he planned to raise beef cattle.

Peter also bought a sack of grass seed. Now, if you're going to raise cattle, it's a good idea to have some grass growing somewhere, so this probably isn't surprising. Peter wanted to plant ryegrass, because he'd seen the virtues of ryegrass when he lived in Oregon and worked for a seed company.

The person who sold him the grass seed suggested something called festulolium (yes, it takes a few tries to get that one to roll off the tongue easily). That's a type of ryegrass (from the Lolium family) that had been bred in Europe to contain some genes from meadow fescue, which is from the Festuca family.

So Peter took the merchant's word for it, and planted the festu-

ryegrass--both of which are nutritious perennial plants--for use in pastures?

The answer probably made Peter laugh: "Because they never last more than a year!"

As you can imagine, Peter had a different answer for that professor-about-to-turn-scientist: "My festulolium has lasted for six years, despite being overgrazed and underfertilized. It's survived all those Wisconsin winters and the droughts of 1988 and 1989."

As you can also imagine, the professor-about-to-turn-scientist wasn't about to take Peter's word for this, so he went to visit Peter's farm in Spring Green, Wis.

There, he and Peter dug up some of those amazing festulolium plants, and the professor/scientist crossbred them with some festulolium plants that were surviving in university nursery plots sprinkled around Wisconsin. Those nursery plot plants were kind of like the Marines of the plant world; they'd survived the same type of "get tough or die" conditions that prevailed on Peter's farm.

Sure enough, the festulolium plants hung in there like grim death. So the professor/scientist obtained a U.S. Department of Agriculture small business

of the plants in the northern United States. In 1996, breeder seed of the new variety, called "Spring Green," was produced.

Then another company, Rose Agri-Seed, Inc., obtained the exclusive marketing rights for Spring Green. Rose Agri-Seed later had the seed grown in Alberta, Canada, where it does tend to get a bit nippy--winter temperatures can dip to 65 degrees below zero in northern Alberta, although they're a comparatively balmy 51 degrees below zero in southern Alberta--on land certified for organic farming. In its first few years on the market, 200,000 pounds of the organically grown seed were sold.

The professor who's now an ARS scientist says this is an unusual story in that it includes the direct involvement of the farmer through all phases of development and marketing of the new plant variety. He readily admits that this new variety would have never seen the light of day without that partnership with the farmer.

As for Peter the farmer, he's now collecting royalties from the offspring of that first bag of seed--offspring that have become both a widely popular conventional grass seed and the first ryegrass in North America to be certi-

"I believe that any human being, child, that is born and grows up should have the opportunity to be a great somebody and I believe that the training of 4-H club work helps move them in that direction so that they can become a great somebody."
