**SUBJECT** Request for Location and Design Approval

**Description and Project Proposal:** The proposed project is located along 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue beginning at Fellowship Road, turning on Lynburn Drive to Burns Avenue; along 2<sup>nd</sup> Street from Railroad Avenue to Fellowship Road, and along 4<sup>th</sup> Street from Railroad Avenue to Lavista Road. The proposed project consists of approximately 0.90 miles of concrete sidewalk including ADA compliant curb cut ramps, ADA compliant driveways, decorative brick paver strips, crosswalks, retain existing on-street parking, and drainage improvements. The proposed sidewalks vary in width. These improvements will enhance the accessibility to MARTA bus route #75 & #124 which service the area with stops along Main Street at 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue. As part of the TEE funded portion of the project, additional improvements along the corridor may include landscaping, benches, trash receptacles, bike racks, and pedestrian/street lighting. Bicycles will share the road with all other vehicles and the roads will be striped with SHARROWS. Upgrades to the drainage inlets will be bicycle friendly.

**Concept Approval Date:** 5/1/2014

**Concept Update:** As the project has developed, the sidewalk was extended slightly along Lynburn Drive and Fellowship Road. After turning from 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue onto Lynburn Drive, the proposed sidewalk extends to Lawrenceville Highway and ties into the existing sidewalk at the southwest corner of Lynburn Drive and Lawrenceville Highway. Additionally, the sidewalk now turns from 2<sup>nd</sup> Street onto Fellowship Road to tie into the existing sidewalk on the east side of Fellowship Road.


