AUBURN, Ala. — Anthony Morgan was out of his element, an offensive player on the other side of the ball, trying to help an Auburn defense with an alarming lack of cornerback options.

Now back at running back, the junior recalled the experience, struggling for a polite way of giving himself a grade on defense.

"Uh...I...It's not good," he said with a laugh. "I worked at it and I tried my best. That's all I could do."

In his two-plus years on the Plains, Morgan has gone through about as many positions as he has names. The former Anthony Gulley, who went by Gulley-Morgan before simply Morgan, has been, in coach Gene Chizik's words, "a journeyman," spending time at punt returner, wide receiver, running back and

cornerback since he arrived in 2009.

Now he is a running back, where beyond workhorse Mike Dyer and speedster Onterio McCalebb, the Tigers have few reliable options, especially with pass-catchers Mario Fannin and Eric Smith no longer around.

"He gives us a lot of flexibility," offensive coordinator Gus Malzahn said. "We can move him around... He's a really good runner, especially in open space, and he catches the ball very well out of the backfield."

Morgan has a history of carrying the ball. He played running back his entire career at Brantley (Ala.) High, running for 1,162 yards and 18 touchdowns as a senior.

Given a taste of the position as a freshman against Furman in 2009, he showed great

burst and instincts, running for 77 yards on five carries and scoring on touchdown runs of 13 and 50 yards.

"He's talented," running backs coach Curtis Luper said.

"He's fast, he's smart, he's tough. He just has to learn to play the position. He hasn't played it. For him, it's just matter of getting comfortable with the offense, the system. I'm expecting big things from him."

It will take some adjusting. Despite breaking out against Furman, Auburn moved him to defense late in 2009. Injuries ravaged the Tigers' defensive backfield and Morgan, who dabbled at punt returner and wide receiver but had no major role, was a logical choice to step in as an emergency corner.

He never felt comfortable.

"I just didn't have the fundamentals," he said. "Nobody sat down in high school and taught me the fundamentals of playing cornerback. All I did was playing running back."

That's why last Decem-

ber was music to his ears. Coaches approached him in December about a position switch as the team prepared for the BCS title game.

He got his chance in the "Toilet Bowl," a name players give to a bowl scrimmage for redshirts, walk-ons and backups. He looked good enough for coaches to keep him at running back.

"I told him I feel like he's in the best spot since he's been here to help us," Chizik said. "I feel like he feels at home there."

Morgan has bulked up for the job. He is only 5-foot-9 but is at 195 pounds, 20 more than when he arrived at Auburn. He also said he is faster, but the physical side won't be the biggest adjustment.

"He just has to learn our offense and learn the reads," Luper said. "And everything is expedited because it's no-huddle. He doesn't have time to process everything just yet. So I really can't see what he can do until he gets comfortable, and then he can let his natural ability take over. But I think he'll be pretty good."

Notice is hereby given in compliance with Georgia Code 22-2-109 and 32-3-5 that the Georgia Department of Transportation has approved the Location and Design of this project.

The date of location approval is March 23, 2011.

The project is located on the north side of the City of Columbus in Muscogee County, within Land Districts 8 and 19, and Land Lots 21, 40, 263, 264, 268, 269, 270, 294, and 295. The project begins just south of the intersection of SR 1/US 27/Veterans Parkway with Old Moon Road (mile log 15.18) and ends north of Turnberry Lane (mile log 16.74) at Hancock Road for a total length of 1.56 miles.

Between Old Moon Road and Moon/Williams Roads the existing five-lane rural roadway will be widened to accommodate a four-lane urban section with raised median and turn lanes. Between Moon/Williams Roads and Turnberry Lane the existing two-lane road will be reconstructed to include a four-lane urban section with raised median and turn lanes. From Turnberry Lane to Hancock Road, the facility will transition to a 4-lane rural section with a depressed median, for 165' of length, and then taper to the existing 2-lane section at Hancock Road. The project will include major intersection improvements at SR 1/US 27 and Moon/Williams Roads. Included with the intersection improvements will be the widening of approximately 630' of Williams Road and 780' of Moon Road to accommodate a four-lane urban section with raised median and dual left turn lanes. The project extends an additional total of 675' along Williams Road in order to transition from the proposed four-lane section to the existing two-lane roadway. The project also will include the addition of sidewalks along both sides of the SR 1 to improve pedestrian access throughout the corridor.

Justin Anderson has moved back to offense after one year at guard. The year on the other side of the ball has Anderson catching up a bit, Friend said, and the rising senior also isn't completely healed from his turf toe injury. **Brent Benedict**, another option at guard, also is getting back up to

speed after knee surgery 19 months ago.

Alec Ogletree update

Defensive coordinator **Todd Grantham** said **Alec Ogletree**, who has shifted from safety to inside linebacker, will have an easier adjustment because he already is familiar with the play calls. Grantham issued reminders Tuesday as to why the change was made.

"The reason we made the moves we made was to create depth and to get some guys that we feel can make plays, closer to the ball," Grantham said. "It's also created an opportunity for someone in the secondary to step up and take that position."

Secondary coach **Scott**

Lakatos said he didn't fight the move of Ogletree, saying he deferred to what made the defense better overall. Last year, **Shawn Williams** and **Jakar Hamilton** couldn't hold off Ogletree for the starting safety spot; now, they have another shot at it.

He still is hoping to avoid knee surgery, which likely would shut him down for the season.

They also lost right fielder Jayson Werth to the Nationals. Left fielder Raul Ibanez is clearly in decline. After hitting 34 homers in 134 games two years ago, he hit only 16 in 155 games last season.

The Braves have three big question marks.

One is how well third baseman Chipper Jones will fare after tearing his knee late last season. Jones has had a tremendous spring, but he is 39 and has been injury prone for the past several seasons.

Another is in center field. After the disastrous season he had last year, the only reason Nate McLouth was brought back was because he had too big a contract for the Braves to trade or cut.

McLouth has shown signs this spring that he is ready to return to the form he displayed in Pittsburgh. But after a year-and-a-half of disappointment from McLouth, it is hard to count on him.

The third big question mark is Freddie Freeman. The big first baseman tore up the minor leagues, but he will be a rookie for the upcoming season. The Braves need him to carry his minor league success with him into this season.

Going into the season with that many question marks makes it difficult to think the Braves can overcome the Phillies' rotation and win the NL East.

Look for the Braves to finish second by a game or two and qualify for the playoffs again as a wild-card team.

TEXAS A&M 76, NOTRE DAME 70

Aggies win title

INDIANAPOLIS — Danielle Adams scored 22 of her 30 points in a dominating second half and Texas A&M beat Notre Dame 76-70 on Tuesday night to win its first national championship.

Texas A&M (33-5) built an early 13-point lead with its aggressive defense, fell behind by seven in the second half, then rallied by pounding the ball inside to the 6-foot-1 Adams, who bullied her way

to 9-for-11 shooting in the final 20 minutes.

Tyra White added 18 points for the Aggies, including a huge 3-pointer as the shot clock buzzer sounded to put A&M up 73-68 with 1:07 left.

That was enough to bring the title to a school that didn't even admit women until 1963 and to deny a second championship to Notre Dame (31-8), which won 10 years ago in St. Louis.

Skylar Diggins led the Irish with 23 points.

The differences between Mickelson and Woods could be found in their news conferences. Woods was grilled on his swing change under Sean Foley, what he's trying to accomplish, how far along he is in the process and why he changed in the first place.

"I felt that taking a step back, or sometimes even two steps back, there's nothing wrong with that if I'm going to make three, four, five steps forward and becoming better in the end," he said.

Mickelson looked as relaxed as ever.

He spoke of the pure joy of driving down Magnolia Lane, how it energizes his love for the game and for this tournament.

And for more than a half-hour, he sprinkled in his share of one-liners.

But he wouldn't touch a couple of questions. One was whether he thought Woods, with 14 majors, could surpass the 18 majors won by Jack Nicklaus. And the other was how it felt to be ordained as the favorite at this Masters.

"I don't know," Mickelson said. "I certainly enjoy this place and have it enjoyed and have felt great on this golf course even before I won here. I felt like it was a course I could play well on, and I really enjoy playing it every year."

Tiger or Phil? He'll leave that to others. And even though both players appear to be going in different directions, it's not an easy answer.

"Tough one," Nick Watney said. "I'd say they're 1-A and 1-B."

He just didn't say which was which.

the world, was asked who is the more dominant player at the Masters.

"I think Phil," he replied. And here's what one player had to say about Woods, a four-time Masters champion.

"I don't think he'll finish in the top five," Ian Poulter said. "The shots he was hitting at Doral, they were very inconsistent. You can't hit shots like that on this golf course and get away with it. I don't think you want to rely on your short game that much around this place."

Woods hasn't been chopping it up at Augusta. He also has three wins over the last 10 years, and that doesn't include his record 12-shot victory as a 21-year-old in 1997. He was the runner-up in consecutive years, and his tie for fourth a year ago was impressive considering it was his first competition in five months following a humiliating sex scandal.

What makes Mickelson stand out are the 18 birdies he made on the weekend at the Houston Open to win by three shots, his first victory since the Masters last year.

"I felt like that golf was in me this year, but I haven't been getting it out," Mickelson said. "I haven't had the same type of mental focus throughout the round that I expect. So to be able to have that type of performance heading into here feels very good. Reminds me a lot of 2006, when I was able to put it together the week before and carry the momentum through."
